

Our worship style is quite formal- but we hope relaxed-as we come to worship God in our midst. Please do join us for coffee after the service.*

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**Today we celebrate the Feast of Corpus Christi when we give thanks for the gift of the sacrament of Holy Communion—the constant reminded of the God's presence with us. Today we will also give thanks for the Baptism of Charlie Pietro Patrick Battaglia and welcome him into our wider church family.**

*A Priest will greet us. Please stand when the bell is rung. We sing our Processional Hymn 11 as the Clergy enter.*

## The Gathering

### **Our Gospel Reading/ Thought for the day**

*Holy Communion, the sharing of blessed Bread and Wine, is the central act of Christian Worship. It brings us together, signifies our unity and through it we come into the very Presence of God Himself. Each year at this time we keep the ancient Festival of Corpus Christi- the Body and Blood of Christ. We give thanks for the gift of Christ in Communion and reflect on how we share in the communion of our Church life. Liturgy means the work of the people. Through this liturgy we celebrate God and offer ourselves, seeking a deeper spirituality. The liturgy provides us with a language for talking to God: for praising God, thanking God, offering ourselves to God, expressing our deepest sorrows and longings, and acknowledging God's presence. The Eucharist embraces all that we are confronted with in our life and community. Each time we share together we can be vulnerable and honest in the presence of God.*

### **The Collect**

*The Priest introduces a period of silent prayer and then sings a prayer*

Holy Spirit, sent by the Father, ignite in us your holy fire; strengthen your children with the gift of faith, revive your Church with the breath of love, and renew the face of the earth, through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

*We are seated as we hear our first reading from Genesis 14: 18-20*

*A reading from the book of Genesis*

*And King Melchizedek of Salem brought out bread and wine; he was priest of God Most High. He blessed him and said, 'Blessed be Abram by God Most High, maker of heaven and earth; and blessed be God Most High, who has delivered your enemies into your hand!'*

*And Abram gave him one-tenth of everything.*

This is the Word of the Lord.

**Thanks be to God.**

*We share in an acclamation for the Feast Day*

I am the bread of life, anyone who comes to me shall not hunger, anyone who believes in me shall never thirst.

**Alleluia. Lord, give us this bread always.**

The bread of God comes down from heaven, and gives life to the world.

Anyone who eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life and I will raise them up on the last day.

*We remain seated as we sing our Gradual Hymn.670*

*We hear a reading from the New Testament. 1 Corinthians 11: 23-26*

*We hear a reading from the first letter to the Corinthians*

*For I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took a loaf of bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, 'This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me.' In the same way he took the cup also, after supper, saying, 'This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.' For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.*

This is the Word of the Lord.

**Thanks be to God.**

*The Gospel is processed to the middle of the Church as we sing Alleluia (Hymn 29 verse 1). please stand.*

**Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia ...**

*The Gospel is announced. (John 6: 51-58 )*

The Lord be with you.

**And also with you.**

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John

*At the end.*

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

**Praise to You, O Christ.**

*The Gospel is carried back to the Altar as we sing Alleluia, again.*

*We sit to listen to the sermon, after which there is a period of silence*

*We stand to affirm our faith in the words of the creed.*

**I believe in God, the Father almighty,  
creator of heaven and earth.**

**And in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord,  
who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,  
born of the Virgin Mary,  
suffered under Pontius Pilate,**

*The president breaks the consecrated bread.*

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.

**Though we are many, we are one body,  
because we all share in one bread.**

*We sing the Agnus Dei.*

**Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world, have  
mercy on us**

*The Elevation*

This is Jesus the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. Blessed are those who are called to his supper.

Mysterium by Lauridsen . If you would receive communion in your  
own church you are welcome to receive at this altar. You may also  
like to come forward for a blessing.*

*At the end of communion the priest will lead us in a period of  
silence, and then a short prayer:*

**All praise to you, our God and Father, for you have fed  
us with the bread of heaven and quenched our thirst  
from the true vine: hear our prayer that, being grafted  
into Christ, we may grow together in unity and feast  
with him in his kingdom; through Jesus Christ our Lord.  
Amen**

*We listen to the notices about our community life.*

**The Dismissal** (please stand)

THE GIVING OF A LIGHTED CANDLE

Pray my friends that this our sacrifice may be acceptable to God the Almighty Father.

**May the Lord accept this sacrifice at your hands, for the praise and glory of His name, for our good and the good of all His Church.**

The Lord be with you,  
**And also with you.**

Lift up your hearts.

**We lift them up to the Lord.**

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

**It is right to give thanks and praise.**

*The preface continues until we sing.*

**Holy, Holy, Holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna, Hosanna, Hosanna in the highest.**

**(+)Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna, Hosanna, Hosanna in the highest.**

*After the Consecration*

Christ is the bread of life:

**When we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim your death, Lord Jesus, until you come in glory.**

*At the end of the Eucharistic Prayer we sing Amen*

*We join in the prayer that Jesus taught his friends to say.*

**Our Father, who art in heaven hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us, and lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil. For thine is the Kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen**

**was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the (+) resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen**

*We kneel or sit as we prayer for the Church, the World and for this community. During the prayers we use the response:*

Lord in your mercy,  
**Hear our Prayer.**

*Sometimes we will also use the words after we pray for those who have died:*

Rest Eternal, Grant unto them O Lord  
**And may light perpetual shine upon them.**  
May they rest in peace  
**And rise in Glory.**

*At the conclusion of the prayers we say.*

Merciful Father,  
**accept these prayers for the sake of your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.**

*Thanksgiving for the gift of baptism*

*Benelia, Stefano and Charlie are introduced to the congregation:*

Baptism marks the beginning of a journey with God which continues for the rest of our lives. In the last *months Charlie's Family* has been exploring the meaning of baptism in Jesus Christ . They have looked together at the call to discipleship in the world and in the Church. They have sought to understand the responsibilities of discipleship in today's world. We celebrate with them Charlie's baptism which took place last weekend in

Canossa', Italy, as we all seek to learn with them the Way of Christ. God in Christ gives us water welling up for eternal life. With joy you will draw water from the wells of salvation.

**Lord, give us this water and we shall thirst no more.**

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

**It is right to give thanks and praise.**

Blessed are you, sovereign God of all,  
to you be glory and praise for ever.

You are our light and our salvation.

From the deep waters of death  
you have raised your Son to life in triumph.

Grant that all who have been born anew by water and the Spirit  
may daily be renewed in your image,

walk by the light of faith,

and serve you in newness of life;

through your anointed Son, Jesus Christ,

to whom with you and the Holy Spirit

we lift our voices of praise.

Blessed be God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

**Blessed be God for ever.**

*The minister leads the congregation in the Commission*

Those who are baptized are called to worship and serve God.

Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship,  
in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

**With the help of God, I will.**

Will you persevere in resisting evil,

and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

**With the help of God, I will.**

Will you proclaim by word and example  
the good news of God in Christ?

**With the help of God, I will.**

Will you seek and serve Christ in all people,  
loving your neighbour as yourself?

**With the help of God, I will.**

Will you acknowledge Christ's authority over human society,  
by prayer for the world and its leaders,  
by defending the weak, and by seeking peace and justice?

**With the help of God, I will.**

Eternal God, our beginning and our end,  
preserve in your people the new life of baptism;  
as Christ receives us on earth,  
so may he guide us through the trials of this world  
and enfold us in the joy of heaven,  
where you live and reign,  
one God for ever and ever. **Amen.**

*All are sprinkled with Holy Water as a reminder of their Baptism.*

**We prayer for the family**

that they may continue to grow in the grace of Christ,

take their place among the company of your people,  
and reflect your glory in the world.

May the lord bless you and keep you, may the lord shine upon you  
and give you peace. **Amen**

*We share the peace with those around us until the offertory Hymn 684  
is announced. We sing the offertory Hymn during which a collection is  
taken.*

God our sustainer, receive the gifts we bring before you, and  
feed us continually with that bread which satisfies all hunger,  
your Son our Saviour Jesus Christ. **Amen**
